Our vision comes from our calling...

We are called to encourage belonging, and nurture believing, so that we may all become followers of Jesus who share God's love for the world.

'Jesus was a guest at a wedding in Cana in Galilee'.

The words, familiar from the Wedding Service, come from a story near the beginning of John's Gospel. (John 2.1 – 11) This story is the inspiration for our transforming vision.

Jesus was with his disciples and with his mother, at the wedding of an ordinary couple in a little mountain village. As today, it was a special moment of celebration for family and friends. Embarrassment and disappointment loomed when the wine ran out. How can you celebrate without wine?

On one level Jesus' action in quietly turning water into wine was simple kindness. He saved the day for those he was with.

But for the Gospel writer, this 'sign' (verse 11) is the key to God's purposes through Jesus. He says it was the 'first' of Jesus' signs. The Greek word means, not just the first miracle in his gospel, but the 'ruling' one through which we can understand them all.

It is a story of total transformation. The most ordinary substance of all – water – is **transformed** into wine of the finest quality in the most abundant quantity. It is a sign of what God is doing for us in Christ – and what he is doing for the whole creation. This is the good news we treasure at Seasalter.

Through belonging, believing, becoming at St Alphege, Seasalter, we can indeed see our lives, our town and our world being transformed by the power of God's love in Jesus Christ.



Our story and the values we share

In recent times, God has led his people at Seasalter on a surprising and delightful journey of movement and growth.

From the tiny Old Church on Church Lane, Seasalter congregations have moved through Joy Lane School, Seasalter Women's Institute Hall and Seasalter Free Church.

The church's sense that God was calling it to keep the vision for growth and to take steps of faith led to the opening of Seasalter Christian Centre in 2007.

Many great lessons were learned along the way – some of these were captured in the church's purpose statement and its list of values. These are our sense of 'what God is doing here' and of the transforming life of Christ in us.

These words and phrases might give you a sense of what we're about – the church we believe God is calling us to be.

Congregations and small groups

Seasalter is **one** church, presently with **five** congregations and a network of small groups.

Each of our congregations is **different**, with different people and different styles. We rejoice in our difference, because there is a place for everyone. But we also rejoice in our **unity** – we are one family in Christ, with the same vision and values.

We call our small groups **cells**. They meet at various times and places during the week. Cells carry the same 'DNA' as the congregations – they have the same vision and values.

You could say that the Body of Christ at Seasalter is made up of small cells which go to make up the larger congregations, which make the whole church. Cells make up the Body.

You can be on the **belonging**, **believing**, **becoming** journey at Seasalter through being part of a cell or a congregation. Or, best of all, both!

Our prayer is that God will grow his church. This means we feel called to start new congregations, and new cells.
