The Vast Ocean of Gods Love and Grace



In my first curacy from 1994 to 1998 in Paddock Wood we always began the new year by saying this prayer together.

I am no longer my own, but thine.

Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt.

Put me to doing, put me to suffering.

Let me be employed for thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee.

Let me be full, let me be empty.

Let me have all things, let me have nothing.

I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal.

And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit,

thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it.
And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.

It is the Covenant Prayer written by John Wesley. We used it because the church where I was curate was a Local Ecumencial Partnership between an Anglican and Methodist church.

I have been reflecting on the theme of selfdenial recently and comparing it to some of the themes in Buddhism which is an increasingly popular religion and philosophy in our culture today. In Buddhism too there is the theme of dying to self and in particular dying to desire, through self-control and meditation. Buddhists try and escape the power of their own passions through reflection and self-discipline as part of their spiritual journey.

However, where Buddhism and Christianity part company is that we as Christians believe that through this self-denial and abandonment to God, we will find an even richer source of life that is found in the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives. As we die to self, so we live for Christ. We abandon our own desires and demands, in order that we truly find ourselves alive in Christ.

As we begin this new year, we need to reflect on those words of Christ, "Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it." Matthew 10.39 and elsewhere in the gospels. Yes I agree with the Buddhists that the way to freedom is to escape the powerful control of our own self-centred desires. Where I part company, and where I hope you part company, is in our conviction that beyond this escape from the prison of self we find the vast ocean of God's love and grace available to us through Christ.

As we press on into 2017, let us ask for more of that presence of Christ. In the words of that chorus by David Bryant from the 1980's "Jesus take me as I am, I can come no other way. Take me deeper into you, may my flesh life melt away. Make me like a living stone, crystal clear and brightly honed, Life of Jesus shining through, giving glory back to you."
