UNITY UPDATE

November 2017

Rev Rachel Webbley writes:

From All Saints Day, All Souls Day, Bonfire night and Remembrance Sunday, this month is all about memories. The dying year echoes these liturgical and secular themes of death and decay. Our memories shape us, both collectively and as individuals. In our country our most recent shared memory of war has been World War II, while we still remember to pray regularly for the people in our armed forces who are still in active service. The English civil war is a distant memory from history lessons, with what seem quaint distinctions between Roundheads and Cavaliers.

For the people of Spain, however, there is a much closer living memory of civil war from the '30s, and even more recent experience of the oppressive regime of General Franco that grew out of that, who died in the year that I was born, 1975. In the face of on-going uncertainty, each Sunday we remember Christ's actions, and that remembering shapes us as a people set apart for God. We are not set apart for complacency however, but to model radical love, and faithful prayer for those who live under the shadow of violence and fear.

Let us pray that the memories of division and violence in Spain help both sides value peace for all the men women and children in that country. Let us also remember to pray for mutual flourishing within our own church, both locally and nationally.
