# Are you keeping a good Lent?



I hope so, because in all the business of our lives we desperately need space for reflection and Lent is the one time in the year that has held on to its inner meaning: no-one has dreamt up a way of turning it into a commercial opportunity ... yet. I suppose someone could try and sell Lent Calendars (that's the sort you put a chocolate *into* everyday) or perhaps an enterprising maker of ash grey paint could try and encourage us to copy the Hindu festival of Holi, when people throw colour paint powder over each other in the street.

No, Lent is still Lent: the time for reflection and examination of our inner lives. We know where it is all leaving, of course, the peace of Lent leads to the horror of Good Friday and then on to the glorious joy of Easter. You will already have decided what your fast will be, it might be those chocolates, and I hope that you will also have decided what your **extra** is for Lent, that which you are taking on in a desire to give more to God or to neighbour. I also hope that both those disciplines are going well for you and being a source of blessing.

Just thinking about the other end of Lent for a moment though: we do these things for a purpose, to help us enter into the journey. It is, in truth, a journey that all Christian disciples are on, from the darkness of being detached from God, through a time of testing and reflection, and onto the moment of realisation – 'Yes, this is my faith: Jesus Christ has died, Jesus Christ has risen, Jesus Christ will come again'. Fast or slow, sudden or prolonged, it is the process of the conversion of our lives from darkness to light, the glorious risen light of Christ. So keep a good Lent but let it lead you also to an Easter of rejoicing.
