

The Annual Ride and Stride (a round-the-churches sponsored bike ride/walk) takes place every 2nd Saturday in September - this year it's the 14th September 2019


Derek and Rita Lofts used to be the reps for Seasalter for many years but we haven't had reps for a bit.. the job involves:
