UNITY UPDATE

Dear Friends.

I am writing this in the middle of May, in a week that saw the death of two Christian people who could well the first of the L'Arche Christian be called prophets for our time. The younger was Rachel Held Evans, who was 37, the older was Jean Vanier, who was 90 years old.

Rachel Held Evans was American, an Anglican from an Evangelical/ Charismatic background who was a journalist by trade but transitioned to writing on Christian themes. Her great contribution to Christian conversation in her country was not merely to admit the existence of doubt but to celebrate it as the way in which we learn to understand what our faith is really teaching us. She sadly died because of a reaction to a medicine given her to treat a bout of influenza. Her determination to seek out the right questions led her to challenge old certainties and old attitudes as not being the fullness of the Christian faith - the Holy Spirit leads us into all truth but that cannot happen if we delude ourselves that we already know all the answers.

lean Vanier was a Canadian Catholic who is best known for establishing

communities, where disabled and able-bodied people together as a household to learn from one another. He once said that he had thought that by founding such a community he would be doing something to help those who were less fortunate than himself but in reality the gift flowed the opposite way as he learned the full meaning of humanity from them. He gave all his life to the task of encouraging people to be more humane, to explore the fullness of the meaning of humanity, to give rather than to receive. He maintained that the disabled were not burdens but rather a source of wisdom to those who are willing to learn. So, one prophetic figure who lived out his faith ... and one who thought out her faith: we owe them both a debt of gratitude for their strenuous efforts to be faithful in the twenty-first century. May they rest in peace and rise in glory - and may we have the sense to learn from them. Rev David Vannerley
