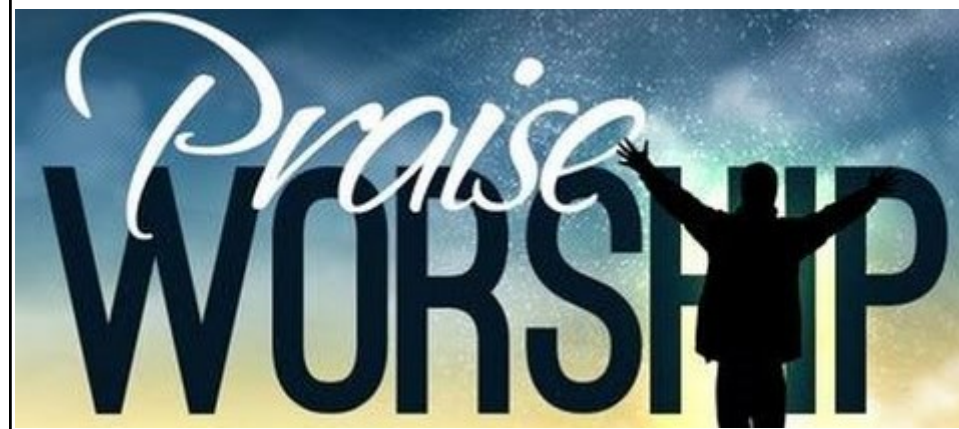

Dennis Spinner - Update

Thank you everyone for your prayers and support. Dennis is back home now from his London hospital stay and he is doing really well. All went according to plan except inserting the grommets as the surgeons found they could not even insert a micro grommet as Dennis' ear canals are so small (the size of a 1mm needle). We are disappointed as we were hoping grommets would improve his hearing.

The doctors will review grommets when Dennis is bigger in size. In the meanwhile Dennis has turned another corner this week as he started at a mainstream non-medical pre-school nursery. Also this week his Cardiac team stopped two of the medicines that Dennis has been on for nearly 3 years as they felt that his pulmonary hypertension is improving. Dennis has also started to practise standing and saying "Dada" ("Mama" got a look in over a year ago!). Please continue to pray for his good health and strength, especially as Autumn and Winter approaches when Dennis is more vulnerable to bugs and colds. 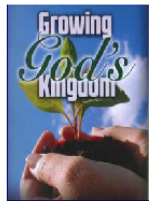
