Jane Myhill - new things



Doreen

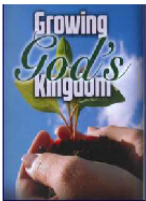
