District Church Council

The DCC met recently and, first of all, spent time considering the shape of the Children's and Families' Ministry after Jane leaves at the end of October. Neil Robertson was confirmed as the new Deputy Churchwarden and Helen Prettyjohn was appointed as the DCC's representative on the PCC Standing Committee.

The financial situation looks a bit more positive with the possibility that the General Fund might break even this year. The Council noted that the Revd David Vannerley (St John's) will be retiring next summer and that will probably mean changes in the way the clergy team works.

Other issues on the agenda were GDPR, safeguarding, the Old Church, Little Oaks, a new pastoral network and communications. But thanks to the prayers of many the Council finished its meeting on time (10 o'clock) with all the members still smiling. (There will be an extra meeting in October to continue discussions on the Vision.)

he GDPR sets out how organisations must act when dealing with the personal data of individuals. Personal data includes such information as name, address, telephone number, financial information, health records etc etc.
