Rev David Vannerley writes:

Do you know the poem that ends: 'God was man in Palestine ... and lives today in bread and wine'?

Words of John Betjeman in his reflection on the Advent season called Christmas. I have this real struggle with starting Christmas the day after we put our poppies aside for another year – it means that we do not stop to think about the need to get ready for Christmas at all. Advent is there for a good reason: it calls on us to stop, to reflect and to pray that the Christchild will truly be present to us all. Not just in sentiment. Not just in fripperies. Especially not in excessive eating and drinking.

The Feast of the Nativity is a spiritual challenge to everyone to make room for Christ the Lord in the heart of our lives. Yes, he did once come and live as a human person, experiencing all the joys and tragedies of human life, including his own awful death and suffering but that was not the end. He was so full of the superabundance of God's life that not even death could stop him:

and his life continues to abide with us. That is the significance of the church's family meal of the Eucharist, his life energising our lives to continue his mission to our world.

So do, please, have a very merry Christmas but not until you have first had a prayerful, engaged and worshipful Advent: the Christmas that follows will then be all the more powerful and blessing for us all.
