White Ribbon UK was founded in 2005, and is part of the global movement to end male violence against women. On Monday alongside our partners in Rochester, Canterbury Diocese officially signed up to promote the cause and raise awareness of the issue.

The Archdeacon of Canterbury, The Venerable Jo Kelly-Moore, joined Bishop Simon in Chatham to pledge support to the White Ribbon campaign.

Every week two women are killed by their partners or ex-partners and 7 out of 8 victims of domestic violence are women.

The campaign recognises that violence/abuse takes place from women to men and in same sex couples etc and therefore also signposts to organisations that support in these areas.
