War Graves

There are two graves in the churchyard of servicemen who died in the Second World War.



Sergeant Allan Williams (26) of the RAF was involved in bombing raids over Germany. He was the son of a Whitstable couple, Arthur and Elizabeth Williams. On the night of 31 January 1943 he was the navigator in a Lancaster bomber which took off from Waddington in Lincolnshire as part of a raid over Hamburg. When the plane returned it was diverted because of bad weather and crashed into a hillside in Yorkshire.

William H Mitchell (45) was an Engineman in the Royal Naval Patrol Service. He served on HMS Liffey and was taken ill and died on 3 March 1944. In the Second World War the RNPS consisted of thousands of small boats such as trawlers (like HMS Liffey), motor launches and fuel carriers, which carried out convoy escort work, minesweeping and anti-submarine patrols. More than 15,000 RPNS servicemen died doing this work around Britain's coasts. Churchill said of them "No work has been more vital than yours; no work has been better done. The ports were kept open and Britain breathed. The Nation is proud of you."

In the corner of the churchyard nearest to the car park are two graves which are reputedly those of two German airmen who died near Whitstable. The crosses marking the graves are dilapidated and are being restored. If anyone has information about these graves we would be interested to hear it.
