RSPB Advice on providing water for wild birds

During the hot, dry weather it is useful to put out water for birds for drinking, bathing and nest building (to make mud for swallows and house martins).

The receptacle needs to have shallow sloping sides with a shallow approach to water. To allow different species to bathe, provide a sloping bath, so the water is between 2.5 cm and 10cm (1 - 4 inches) deep. Make sure the surface of the bath is rough so birds can grip with their claws, and not slip. Please replenish/change the water regularly.

Whitstable Team Ministry Bible Studies

(Exploring the Bible's Meaning and Relevance)

Background

For many Christians the weekly sermon is the main place that Christians get to study the Bible and its relevance with others. Many subjects cannot be addressed adequately in the time allocated to sermons. Also the format of a sermon does not allow for interaction such as questions.

St Alphege, Seasalter recently held a "Reading the Bible with Confidence Course". In the course feedback a large number of people asked for the opportunity for further Bible studies. In 2022, following discussion with Rachel Webbley¹, we will be running three Whitstable Team Ministry Bible taster sessions. Subject to feedback we may offer a number of regular sessions in 2023.

Purpose

These sessions will be designed to cover in a little more depth than possible in a sermon, some Bible books, sections of books or themes which run throughout the Bible. Each session will be led by an experienced Bible teacher and there will be opportunity for questions and comments.

Who is this for

These sessions are designed for anyone who wants to get to grips with the Bible. These are for anyone who wants the opportunity, with the help of an experienced Bible teacher, to understand the Bible in greater depth.

When

We have planned three sessions for this year.

- **First session will cover Mark's gospel**, led by the Revd Canon Steve Coneys², **Sunday 12 June 6-8pm** at Seasalter Christian Centre
- **Second session will cover Amos**, It will be led by Revd Dr Sue Woan³. **Weds 7 September 7-9pm** at St Peter's Church Whitstable
- **Third session will cover Revelation**, led by Tariq Hussain, former Baptist minister **Sunday 30 October 6-8 pm** at Seasalter Christian Centre
