

This is a happy time for our theological college. We have returned to face-to-face teaching and, at the same time, expanded our online provision. These days, we're meeting a need for which we've prayed rather mightily. Enthusiasm for learning more about Christian faith, in general, and for studying theology, in particular, is on the rise. You wouldn't believe it from the media, perhaps, but it's true nonetheless.

This growing theological interest needs our best response. St Augustine's is delighted to offer our Certificate in Theology, Ministry and Mission, a course accredited by the University of Durham and available in both face-to-face and online forms. The Certificate requires only some enthusiasm, no previous knowledge of theology. Since starting a program of study is a significant step, to help anyone wishing to stick a toe in rather than jump head-first, we offer a 'taster' module in Biblical Studies. Students take this initial course, at a very reasonable price, and with some dedicated tutorial support. Having completed the taster module, students then decide if they want to continue – and we're delighted with how many do. St Augustine's also has a bursary fund to help those with keen minds but blunted finances.

St Augustine's provides a diverse and supportive learning community that places the Christian formation and educational growth of its students at the core of its vision and mission.
