DCC update from the meeting 10 January - please pray about these things.

Among other items, key issues discussed included:

The sale of the bungalow is progressing, slowly, due to administrative complications to do with the way church and Diocese operate with regard to property. Prayers for those dealing with this and thanks to Andrew Crocombe and others for their work on it.

We are looking at improving access to SCC from the car park.

Work on getting the paths done and the installation of the glass doors up at the Old Church is progressing.

It's still a little too early to be able to quantify the final response to the review of giving (stewardship) that took place in October, but it was noted that feedback was positive about the information and communication at the time, especially in the current climate of financial difficulty.



The annual Parish Share negotiations where we agree together across the Team Ministry how we will pay the required amount take place 1 February at the Team Finance meeting, please pray for this. We reviewed the outcome of the October Attendance Survey (shared in last week's notice sheet). This will help inform the thinking and decision making of the DCC.

The DCC will be working to develop a set of principles relating to the use of the Christian Centre to help us make wise and Godly decisions about balancing church activity and other bookings.

All members of the DCC are required to complete the required C of E Basic and Foundation Safeguarding training, and an additional Domestic Abuse module in order to continue to serve on the DCC.
