Alms-houses

Seasalter Parish Charities (Registered Charity No:213940) is an almshouse charity serving the Seasalter and Whitstable area.

The charity currently has two one bedroom flats (unfurnished) available for eligible applicants. That is people who are resident in the Seasalter and Whitstable area and are in ongoing financial hardship. One flat is in Olympia Way Whitstable and one in Tankerton Road Whitstable. The flat in Tankerton Road is only suitable for someone over the age of 60 and not in full time employment.

Any successful applicant would:

- be responsible for their own utility bills and council tax,

- occupy the flats under licence in accordance with charity law and as a beneficiary of the charity,

- make a monthly contribution to the maintenance costs of an amount between £450 and £500 per month per flat,

- be capable of looking after themselves. (Note: No smoking or pets are allowed at either residence.)
