



NEHEMIAH! A preaching series - 7 Sundays from 26 May.

On the face of it, Nehemiah is about a big building project. At its heart though, it's about vision, purpose and how our energies and activities feed into that, but crucially, it highlights the need for God's people to rebuild their hearts - getting themselves aligned with God and with God's loving purposes.

All of this is going to be very helpful for us as we've travelled through some difficult times together over the last few years, and as we focus on how we build for the Kingdom of God and the future.

Want some homework? Read Ezra and Nehemiah in your Bible. We'll be focussing on Nehemiah, but the two books we have in our Bibles were originally one book in the Hebrew tradition.

Alongside this we'll be doing some practical and prayerful work together to look at all the things we do as a church, and identify the priorities, and discern the gifts and skills God has given each of us and how they can be best used. [Also see notice on page 3.]


