2024 Attendance Survey

First of all, thank you to everyone for your patience and good humour as we collected all the information for our Attendance Survey throughout October.

Here are some of the headlines (figures in brackets are the 2022 numbers, the last time we counted). There may not be any jaw-dropping surprises but it's good to know who we are.

- 187 (214) individuals attended church on at least one Sunday or Wednesday in October – 155 (168) adults and 32 (46) children. There are perhaps a dozen or so regulars who weren't here in October for various reasons.
- Nearly two-thirds of our church family are female.
- Just over a quarter do not live in Whitstable they come from east (e.g. Herne Bay), south (Blean and Canterbury) and west (Faversham). No-one from the north!
- We recorded 19 (27) children aged between 0 and 10, with 13 (19) young people between 11 and 17.
- Our Average Weekly Attendance for October was 94.5 adults and 14 children/young people.
- There is still a gap in our younger adults 14 in their 20's, 12 in their 30's and 13 in their 40's
- Just over half of our adult members are over 60.
- 19 individuals have joined the church in the last year, and exactly half the church family have been members for over 10 years.
