





It's going to be a bit like a church weekend away, squeezed into one special day, and spilling over into the Sunday morning service.

Our Speaker is Rev. Canon Jean Kerr.

Jean and her husband Paul, also a minister, live and serve God in Deal, and have experience of all kinds of churches and contexts - Jean was one of the first women to be ordained priest 30 years ago. Their driving motivation is for anyone and everyone to know the love of Jesus and to find a real faith that works for the ups and downs of life. Jean has a particular ministry of coming alongside churches that have been through a lot of change, and encouraging and inspiring them. Among other responsibilities, Jean is the National Diocesan Co-ordinator of the Thy Kingdom Come prayer initiative. She's an Anna Chaplain, and was the Mission and Community Engagement lead in Rochester Diocese before she retired.

What to expect:
