



#### Our Speaker is Rev. Canon Jean Kerr.

Jean and her husband Paul, also a minister, live and serve God in Deal, and have experience of all kinds of churches and contexts - Jean was one of the first women to be ordained priest 30 years ago. Their driving motivation is for anyone and everyone to know the love of Jesus and to find a real faith that works for the ups and downs of life. Jean has a particular ministry of coming alongside churches that have been through a lot of change, and encouraging and inspiring them. Among other responsibilities, Jean is the National Diocesan Co-ordinator of the Thy Kingdom Come prayer initiative. She's an Anna Chaplain, and was the Mission and Community Engagement lead in Rochester Diocese before she retired.

#### What to expect:

Refreshments and a warm welcome on arrival, worship (led by the Holy Trinity Sittingbourne band) and then two morning teaching sessions from Jean with a coffee break. During those sessions, there will be groups for Children and Young People led by a fabulous team from Holy Trinity Sittingbourne and from St Alphege Whitstable.

After lunch together, a whole bunch of optional activities: indoors and outdoors, fun games, a special creative project, and quiet

areas including a prayer installation at the Old Church. Or plenty of room and time to chat over refreshments and/or board games if you prefer.
