ANNUAL DISTRICT CHURCH MEETING

The church's Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday 11 th May at 1.30pm at SCC following a bring and share lunch after the 10.00 service. *Please note that this is an in-person only meeting and there <u>will</u> <u>not be a Zoom link as in previous years</u>.
